

Exploring Implementation of a New Intervention: Questions to Ask EBP Model Developers or 'Purveyors'

Purpose: The following questions may be useful in exploring key features of an Evidence-Based Practice model and helping an agency to prepare for full scale and successful implementation.

These questions likely follow from an initial exploration of the model (an understanding of the target population, methods or intervention strategies, logic model, results, etc.).

I. General Overview

- □ How did this program become recognized as 'evidence-based?'
 - What are the seminal studies and where were they published?
 - What is/was the target population?
 - What agencies or organizations have deemed it an EBP? At what level?
- □ Where has this intervention been implemented?
 - In what settings? (states, counties, agencies)
 - With what (diverse) populations? Were a wide range of ages, genders, races and ethnicities included in the program evaluations?
- \Box Is there a single agency or organization that oversees dissemination (i.e., a 'purveyor')?

II. Staffing

- □ What are the staffing requirements (number and type)?
- □ What are the minimum staff qualifications (degree, experience)?
- □ What methods are used to select the best candidates (philosophy, skills)?
 - Are there resources available (e.g., Hiring Toolkits) to assist with hiring?
- □ Is there a recommended practitioner-to-client ratio?
- □ Is there a recommended supervisor-to-practitioner ratio?
- □ What is the process for replacing staff who depart? (turnover management strategies)

III. Training and Technical Assistance

- □ Is training required before a site can implement this intervention?
- \Box Who conducts the training, and where is it conducted?
- □ Can staff at implementation sites be certified to conduct the training?
- □ Who is typically trained (practitioners, staff selection interviewers, staff trainers, staff supervisors/coaches, agency administrators)?
- □ How are supervisors prepared to provide effective support for practitioners?
 - Is there a training manual for supervisors?
 - Is there a training manual for agency leaders (e.g., program directors)?
- \Box What is the duration of the training (hours, days)?
- □ Is further training / booster training / retraining required/available?
- \Box What on-site assistance is provided by the developer, if any?

IV. Quality Assurance Mechanisms

- \Box What are the core components that define the essence of the intervention?
- □ Is there a QA / CQI system? And is it web-based?
- □ What is the supervision protocol for providing effective support for practitioners?
- □ How long does it usually take for a new implementation site to become a high-fidelity user of the intervention?
- □ What practical instruments are available to assess adherence and competence of the practitioner's use of the intervention's core components?
- □ What tests have been done to ensure the validity and reliability of the fidelity instruments?

V. Implementation Experience

- □ What have been the biggest challenges to effective implementation? [How might these challenges be overcome?]
- □ What (common) mistakes have been made, and how can we avoid them? [Lessons learning]
- □ Can you provide contact information for two or three directors of implementation sites that are currently in the process of implementing the intervention?

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VI. Costs

- □ How much does it cost to secure the services of the developer, training organization, or purveyor team?
 - What is included in that cost?
 - Is the QA system included?
- □ If the intervention costs more than my budget allows, is there a way to implement only part of the intervention?
- □ Do costs include salaried positions? In-kind costs? Special equipment?
- □ What budgeting supports are available to prospective programs (i.e., Cost Estimators)?

- □ Has your intervention been adapted in any ways that might be relevant to its implementation in a setting like ours (describe your setting) or with a population like ours (describe your population)?
- □ Have you been able to identify whether there are any "core components" of the intervention parts of the intervention that must be implemented and/or should not be adapted?
